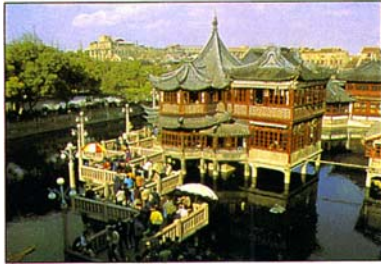




Pacific Grove Chamber of Commerce Invites you to an opportunity to see China! Our trip departs on April 5th, 2010.

The basic 9-day trip includes round trip international air fare, 4 and 5 star hotel stays, three meals each day, Chinese governmental official banquets, deluxe bus tours, English speaking tour guides, admission tickets to all tourist spots and airport taxes throughout the trip. The two options available include all of the above plus either a trip to Xi'an or Guilin. The trip includes transportation with pick up and drop off from Pacific Grove in front of the PG Museum of Natural History.

Congratulations on your interest in our trip to China in April, 2010. Our earlier business trip to China in April, 2009 consisted of 10,000 business people with their families and friends. You will visit memorable sites, both ancient and modern, and enjoy a multitude of unforgettable experiences of professional interest, you will also learn a great deal about how the Chinese business system operates.

As you consider whether to travel along with other business people or just as the regular tourists like yourself, please do not hesitate to ask questions. We recommend that you do some "homework" to help with your decision. Read a few travel guides. Do some research on the Internet. We are convinced that this will be one of the most unique trips you will have the opportunity to make. Please do not wait too long to decide whether to accompany us, as space is limited.

We feel that this tour is an exceptional value. The cost is \$1,949 (per person, based on double-occupancy), and includes your round trip airfare, 5-star or 4-star hotel accommodation, deluxe tour bus, a knowledgeable English-speaking tour guide in each city, three full meals every day, fees for all attractions and any applicable taxes. A single room in all will cost an additional \$450 and an upgrade to business class on the round trip flight is \$4,500. A non-refundable registration fee of \$250 per person is required and due at the time you register no later than January 1. This will be deducted from your total tour fare, the balance of which will be due before January 1.

Securing or updating a passport is your responsibility, and you may also take care of the required visa yourself. However, if you wish us to handle the visa application, you will need to provide us with your passport, a signed visa application form, two passport photos and \$145 before January 1. We will return your passport to you in a timely manner. Should you need assistance completing the visa application, please ask us.

An invaluable pre-tour briefing for all participants will be held (date, time and venue to be announced) at which time we will answer all of your questions and familiarize you with details you will need to know. We have 28 years of experience in the China tour business and feel confident that we can respond to your inquiries to your satisfaction. Whether you have questions on tipping or taxis, luggage or lunches, customs or rest rooms we will prepare you well for your adventure. China is a modern country, so you need not feel as though you are preparing to travel back in time, to a less sophisticated society. In many instances, the country is not "behind" so much as "different." For example, you will find very few ATM machines, but travelers checks and credit cards are accepted everywhere. Leave your checkbooks and check cards behind. The electricity in China is 220 volts and an adapter is required to operate even an American hair dryer. However, both the adapter and the hair dryer are available at the hotels in which we will be staying. Though you will be treated to sumptuous regional foods, you may forgo the chopsticks and grab a Big Mac or a plate of KFC wings. To the dismay of some traditionalists, you may also partake of a genuine Starbucks latte.

CHAMBER MISSION TO CHINA, 2010

Day 1 4/5 San Francisco/Beijing

Board a convenient charter bus in the morning, and travel to San Francisco International Airport for an afternoon flight CA986 by 1:55pm to Beijing. Your adventure begins as you fly trans-Pacific aboard a wide cabin jetliner. Cross the International Dateline.

Day 2 4/6 Beijing(King Wing Hotel/5-Star, 17 Dongsanhuan Rd. S., Tel: 86-10-67668866)

Arrive in Beijing, the Capital of China at 6:15pm. You will be met by your local tour guide at the airport. Transfer to the hotel..

Day 3 4/7 Beijing

Visit the Tian An Men Square, the largest square in the world, and the Temple of Heaven, built in 1420 A.D., where the emperors prayed to the heaven for a good harvest Sightseeing also includes the Palace Museum, also known as the Forbidden City, home of 24 emperors with a total space of 9,999 rooms, and the Summer Palace, known for many significance such as the Long Corridor with painted gallery, Kunming Lake and Longevity Hill, Seventeen- Arch Bridge and Marble Boat.

Day 4 4/8 Beijing

Tour bus excursion to the Great Wall, the 4,000- mile long and 2,000 years old construction is said to be the only man-made structure visible by naked eye from the moon. Visit to the Ming Tombs, one of 13 Ming Emperors' Tombs is fully excavated and open for exploration. Roasted Beijing Duck Dinner.

Day 5 4/9 Beijing/Shanghai/Suzhou(Welth Center Hotel/4-Star, 938 Ganjiang Rd. E.,

Tel: 86-512-65229188) Morning flight CA1519 9:30am/11:30am to Shanghai, then take the tour bus trip to Suzhou. Evening Dinner Show of the traditional Chinese Music.

Day 6 4/10 Suzhou/Hangzhou(Regal Hotel/5-Star, 370 Gym Rd., Tel: 86-571-56199999)

Morning sightseeing to the centuries old Linger Garden, Tiger Hill and Hanshan Temple. Visit to the National Embroidery Institute to see silk embroidery, an important local craft with 1,000 years history. Afternoon tour bus journey to Hangzhou. Visit to Economic Development Zone.

Day 7 4/11 Hangzhou/Shanghai(Guangdong Hotel/5-Star, 328 Yixian Rd., Tel: 86-21-51171888)

Morning boat cruise on West Lake with relaxing stopover at jewel-like pagodas and tea houses. Visit to the centuries old Lingyin Temple, with the main feature of the 64.3 ft-high camphor-wood carved Buddha. Afternoon tour bus trip to Shanghai.

Day 8 4/12 Shanghai

Sightseeing includes the Yu Garden, a maze of marvelous pavilions, ponds, rocky works and over arching trees. Visit to the Bund, a famous waterfront park. Business visit to the Pudong economic development zone.

Day 9 4/13 Shanghai/San Francisco

Depart by a morning flight to take a stopover at Beijing. Afternoon flight CA985 will depart by 5:15pm for San Francisco where you will arrive at 11:55am on the same day and return to your Chamber parking via bus.

OPTIONAL SIDE TRIP TO XI'AN, TRIP 2010

We design this optional trip to Xi'an mainly for those who travel to China for the second time, as they have already visited Suzhou and Hangzhou during their first visit to China.

D1-Day 4, The same itinerary like everybody else.

Day 5, Morning flight to Xi'an, stay at Grand Castle Hotel. Afternoon sightseeing to the Big Wild Geese Pagoda. Evening entertainment of Tang Style Dancing.

Day 6, Morning bus excurses to the Terra-Cotta Warriors at the Tomb of the First Emperor of Qin Dynasty. On the way back, visit the Huaqing Hot Spring Park and Banpo Museum, a preserved pre-historical cavemen site.

Day 7-Day 9, Flight to Shanghai, then the same itinerary like everybody else.

Additional Price: The additional cost is USD450/per person, on the basis tour fare of per person to the regular itinerary. The single room supplement is the same as the regular trip.

The way to handle up: The Chamber assign the passengers to the separate buses for the regular itinerary and side trip itinerary. The passengers with different itineraries are on different buses for whole journey, they cannot see each other for the entire trip. On the basis of group travel, you have to get atleast 10 passengers to start a regular trip or a side trip bus.

OPTIONAL TRIP TO GUILIN, TRIP 2010

We design this optional trip to Guilin mainly for those who travel to China for the second time, as they have already visited Suzhou and Hangzhou during their first visit to China.

D1-Day 4, The same itinerary like everybody else.

Day 5 Beijing/Guilin

Beijing to Guilin by morning flight. Guilin is Located in the northeast of Guangxi Zhuang Autonomous Region. The strangely shaped hills, or karsts, with the verdant vegetation ranging from bamboo to conifers together with wonderful caves make Guilin such an attraction for tourists. Visit the Reed Flute Cave, inside which is a spectacular world of various stalactites, stone pillars and rock formations created by carbonate deposition.

Day 6 Guilin

In the morning take a cruise ride along the Li River, gorgeous Karst peaks give you surprises at each bend of the limpid river under the blue sky, water buffalo patrolling the fields. Lunch will be on board. Cruise arrive at Yangshuo and disembark. Take some free time to explore the West Street in the town lined with western cafes, restaurants and hotels for an experience of Chinese life. Take the bus ride back to Guilin.

Day 7 Guilin/Shanghai

In the morning visit the Elephant Trunk Hill, the symbol of Guilin. The shape of the hill is just like a huge elephant drinking water from the river with its trunk. The Solitary Beauty Peak, located in the ancient Mansion of Prince Jingjiang, in the center of Guilin City. After lunch fly from Guilin to Shanghai,

OPTIONAL TOURS

1. Hutong Tour in Beijing (USD35/pp)

Hutong is a traditional living area for ordinary Beijing citizens, the history of which dates back to 1000 years ago. Hundreds of thousands of houses of traditional architecture style are densely flanked on both sides of narrow and zigzag streets in which people have been living a peaceful and traditional life there through many generations. Tourists will first get on a traditional rickshaw, two for each, for a Hutong tour, riding through those narrow streets tracing the taste of the historical life of an oriental country. Afterwards, tourists will visit local families interviewing their life and cooking Chinese dumplings with the family members. During lunch time, tourists will be served with delicious Chinese domestic dishes and the dumpling tourists make. During the two hours Hutong tour tourists will learn a lot of China's modern life and its people. It is another highlight after the Great Wall.

2. Peking Opera (USD20/pp , USD40/pp for VIP seat)

Peking Opera is the masterpiece of China's traditional culture and art and it is born in Beijing. Until today it is more than three hundreds years old. The Opera lasts an hour and thirty minutes, covering several different plays, of which some are full of fighting and some traditional singing and dancing. The show is beautiful for its colorful costumes, impressive facial designs and staging style of oriental culture.

3. Boat Ride on Grand Canal in Suzhou (USD25/pp)

Grand Canal is a pure artificial object completed 1300 years ago by Chinese people. It starts from Beijing and ends up in Hangzhou with a total length of more than 1,000 miles. During the 50 minutes boat ride on it, tourists may enjoy the view of both modern and old life of Suzhou.

4. Evening Cruise on Huangpu River (USD25/pp)

The cruise will absolutely build in every one an unforgettable impression of Grand Shanghai! The evening view fo Shanghai from the cruise is gorgeous, charming and unbeatable.

5. ERA-Intersection of Time-by Cirque du Soleil (USD35/pp)

As a multimillion-dollar stunning acrobatic extravaganza, the first of its kind in China, ERA is a multimedia odyssey whose inspiration is a direct result of the combination of traditional Chinese acrobatic arts and modern technology. Just like Shanghai, ERA evolves through a constant collision between the past and future. ERA is a love story, yet it is also a contemplation across the millennia, a fascination with that other dimension man has yet to conquer: time. ERA's acrobats are on a quest to find that tenuous point of balance, the intersection between X, Y and Z. Not only will the audience be amazed by the acrobats' control and precision, they will be enchanted by the world that is created through the use of multimedia, technology, lighting and sound effects, elaborate costumes, original live music and a lot more. As such, ERA can remain universal, without language or cultural barriers. A thousand-year-old gesture is worth a thousand emotions, a thousand images, a thousand words. Allow us to feed your imagination and bring your dreams back to the present.

6. Shanghai Maglev Train (one way ticket USD15/pp, round trip USD25/pp)

Shanghai maglev train, the first commercial rail line of its type in the world, links Metro Line 2 at Longyang Road with the Pudong International Airport by a train traveling at top speed of 431 kilometers per-hour which is much faster than the Bullet Train in Japan. Shanghai Maglev Train takes only 7 minutes

and 20 seconds to cover 30 kilometer trip, which currently takes 30 to 40 minutes by driving. Invested with a total amount of 10 billion yuan, it took 2.5 years to complete. Powered by electromagnetism, when running it is suspended in air, about 10 millimeters above the track on a magnetic cushion. It brings a speed revolution to the world in ground transportation, and riding on the train will be an exciting experience for you!

7. The Legend of Kung Fu (USD25/pp)

The Legend of Kung Fu is the a production which combines the elements of kung fu, story-telling, acrobatics, modern dance, and original music to celebrate the philosophy and skill of martial arts. The show tells the story of a young boy, Chun Yi (the pure one), who in order to pursue spiritual and physical harmony is apprenticed as a monk to learn kung fu. Along the way he overcomes obstacles, is distracted and tempted, but ultimately achieves the designation of master who will enlighten the younger generations. Invited by Canada's most experienced cultural brokers, John Cripton of Great World Artists, 'Chun Yi: The Legend of Kung Fu' had its first North America tour from August 2005 to January 2006. During the time, it played 150 performances in Vancouver, Toronto, Reno and other North American cities and won enormous audience admiration.

- ***Beijing***

- **Jade Factory:** China is rich in its jade resource , therefore jade and its cultural impact to Chinese people and later on to Asians has been historical. Tourists will get a chance to visit Beijing Jade Carving Factory which so far is the biggest jade collection in China. Tourists will find Hundreds of thousands of precious jade, jadeites and handmade jade carvings, the raw material of which come from Northeast and Silk road area of China.

- **Pearl Farm:** The Pearl shop in Beijing has been exhibiting a rich variety of home produced sea pearls and fresh water pearls due to both the historical reason and the modern market . Among them, the king and queen size pearls are really of precious quality. The type of Pearl Powder on sale was first contributed to Qing Dynasty Royal Family as a cosmetic, and they can be found here too.

- **Ming and Qing Dynasty Furniture:** It is an Ancient Furniture Fair. Apart from the antique furniture, there are also a lot of newly made furniture of Ming and Qing Dynasty style to be found in the fair. Shipment is available.

- **Cloisonne Factory:** Born in Beijing 300 years ago, cloisonne is the kind of handmade arts and crafts article used a great deal by royal family and rich families in the past. Now it is popular to every body. Tourists will take a chance to visit the workshop seeing how the beautiful articles been made with their own eyes. The gorgeous design, hand-made workmanship and tremendous types make cloisonne articles really attractive to both domestic and overseas tourists.
